



Master of Acupuncture and Herbal Medicine

Alhambra Medical University was established to train students to be proficient in Acupuncture and Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM). The curriculum focuses on enabling graduates to be proficient in TCM diagnostic skills as well as biomedical concepts and diseases.

Accreditation and Approval | The University is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Herbal Medicine (ACAHM) which enables qualified students to receive Title IV Federal Financial Aid. It is also upon graduation, students are eligible to take the California Acupuncture Board Licensing Exam and National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine (NCCAOM) Examination. The University is approved by the California Bureau of Private Postsecondary Education to offer both English and Chinese classes.

Location | Alhambra Medical University is located in the San Gabriel Valley, a growing multicultural in Southern California. The campus is close to Hollywood, Santa Monica beach resorts and has easy access to public transportation, and abundant recreational and leisure activities.

The University operates on a quarter system, and applications are accepted for the program four times a year in January, April, July and October.

MAHM Program

Eligibility:

- The satisfactory completion of 90 semester units of education at a baccalaureate level education.
- Official transcript(s) from outside the United States need to be evaluated by the reputable foreign credential's evaluation agency.
- Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.25
- For applicant with non-English-Based education, for English track, the following scores are required:
 - TOEFL® iBT: overall 61
 - IELTS: 6.0 in Academic format
 - Duolingo: 90
- Student who is attending other school in the U.S. and meets the requirements above may transfer.
- Credits earned more than Five (5) years prior to admission may only be accepted for transfer after validating and documenting that the student has retained the content knowledge and competencies of the respective course(s) for which transfer credits are being assessed.

Required Documents:

1. Application form
2. \$100 non-refundable application fee
\$150 non-refundable application fee for international student
\$120 non-refundable fee for the charge of overseas mailing fee for I-20
3. Official Transcript(s) from all colleges and/or universities attended.
If the transcripts are from a country where English is not the primary language, it must be translated into English and must be sent to a reputable foreign credentials evaluation agency to evaluate equivalent levels of educational achievement in the U.S.
4. Copy of certificate of graduation or diploma.
5. A personal essay describing yourself and your interest in MSTAM program.
6. Two recommendation letters
7. For applicant with non-English-Based education, TOEFL® iBT or IELTS score must be provided.
8. Copy of Driver's license and US passport or green card.
9. One recent 2"x2" color head shot photo (digital file is acceptable).

Additional documents required for International Student

1. A financial statement showing at least \$23,000 in assets verify the availability to pay educational and living expenses for one year.
2. A copy of a passport that is valid for at least 6 months after the date of entry into the US.
3. Copy of current I-20.
4. Copy of I-94.
5. For transferring international student, a completed transfer release form must be sent to AMU by the school from which the applicant is transferring.

Tuition and Fees

Tuition, fees, and charges are subject to change.

Didactic units: \$185 per unit (total 216 units)

Clinic Internship: \$15 per hour (total 960 hours)

Total: \$54,360 (Estimate)

Financial Aid Eligibility

Eligibility is determined by federal and state regulations and university policy. The amount of your financial aid is determined by subtracting the family contribution from the estimated cost of attendance. You may qualify for both Pell Grant and Federal Direct Loans. Students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) in order to determine their eligibility for Federal financial aid. To apply a Federal Financial Aid, student required to meet the following:

- Be a US Citizen or eligible non-citizen.
- Have a valid social security number.
- Register with Selective Service (if required)
- Maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress Requirements
- Have no defaulted loans or owe any grant repayment.
- Not participate in the sale or possession of drugs while receiving federal student aid.

Cost of living

Studio or single bedroom apartment near the school is approximately \$2,000/month.

Advanced standing assessment:

The actual course work successfully completed at a college or university accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education or, in the case of foreign institutions, recognized by the appropriate government agency is transferrable.

For institutions approved by the California Board of Acupuncture, 100% transfer credit may be awarded, provided that the actual coursework to be transferred has been successfully completed and is equivalent to the relevant coursework hours required at AMU.
